5	Carter/ Lees Road Car Park	
	A number of questions were raised regarding the car park--location/ charges/signage etc Garry advised that questions relating to the above were best addressed directly with Ian Carter	John North

	<p>Geo Tech surveys are to be conducted at both potential Car Park sites Lees and Pa Road.</p> <p>Resource Consent criteria and notification is to be determined via a Consultant. Most probably all affected parties will be notified.</p>	
6	Hot Water Beach to Purangi next key focus	Garry Towler
	<p>Garry Towler stated that there would be a walk right through from Hot Water Beach to Purangi, saying that they would be joining two world famous sites - Hot Water Beach and Cathedral Cove.</p> <p>He said Ngati Hei supported a link there. The track would go round the coast where it could and across country where it was too difficult to follow the coast.</p>	
7	Cathedral Cove Coastal Walk	
	<p>John Gaukrodgers will be organising an evaluation of this route. Initially via boat and then survey work. Preliminary meeting to be arranged.</p>	John North
8	MWH traffic management report	
	<p>Peter Hawley expressed concern and was supported by a number of people that Traffic projections will not portray the chaos that traffic causes during the peak periods and council had promised nothing would be done to progress the Walk until the existing traffic and tourism problems in Hahei and surrounds were solved. However, it seemed the walk was going ahead, and the traffic report was being commissioned to solve the problems the Walk was going to create, rather than those that already existed in the area.</p>	Sam Marshall
9	Grange Road, Hahei Beach Car Park	Sam Marshall
	<p>He said the plan was that TCDC would take over the management of the DOC owned beachfront area at Hahei and the carpark at the top of Grange Road. However this was yet to be finalised pending agreement from iwi.</p> <p>Grange Road carpark would most likely be a pay and display area, or just a drop off area. Council would attempt to push people into the Park and Ride area as far as possible. \$450K had been allocated to the park and ride carpark and was concerned delays would mean not operational for the summer.</p> <p>John North stated that it was TCDC who had instigated the Traffic Management project supported by us and the priority is to come up with the best long term plan. Further discussion will be required re Pay and Display/ Park and Ride options.</p>	
10	Walking Village	All
	<p>Brief discussion on the feasibility of restricting(preventing) visitor vehicles from accessing the Village during peak periods. The objective to create a Walking Village.</p> <p>Ideas included a gated/boom access and except stickers.</p> <p>No doubt this concept will be discussed as part of our Community Plan.</p>

	<p>This resulted in the following motion: <i>That the Hahei Beach Ratepayers Association and the Stakeholders Group approach Waikato Regional Council to increase the fares for the Summer Shuttle and Park & Ride for the upcoming season.</i> <i>Moved Catherine Baloghy Seconded Graham Harsant.</i></p>	Carried
